

March 5, 2014

The Saratoga Town Board met at 6:00 p.m. in the town office. Chairman Rickaby called the meeting to order. Forbes was absent. The meeting was officially noticed.

Frank made a motion to approve the February 19, 2014 meeting minutes. Heeg seconded it. Motion passed.

The Board discussed the hall rental for the Park Institute in December. They use the hall for a Christmas party for the students taking classes. The Board would like to get a fee schedule set up for different groups that rent the hall and would like a reduced rate. Heeg made a motion to allow them to use the hall for \$100, which would help cover the cost of cleaning and heating the hall. Frank seconded it. Motion passed.

The Board discussed the hall rental for the Protect Wood County Group. They would like to use the hall on March 22, 2014 for a public meeting. Frank made a motion to allow the group to use the hall free of charge since this is regarding Town information.

Dave Ryun gave the Constable's report. Ken White pled no contest in court. He was found guilty and has to pay a fine of \$412. He was supposed to attend tonight's meeting to let the Board know his clean-up plan. Dave will give him 30 days and if nothing has been done, he will issue another ticket.

Billie-Jo Kester gave the Treasurer's report. She received 3 submissions for the logo contest. The Board will discuss these at the next regular meeting.

Passineau said that the roads are still scattered slippery. Salt is at a premium and have been told by the State to use very little.

Correspondence was read.

Frank made a motion to approve the bills paid. Passineau seconded it. Motion passed.

Wally Scholl gave the Board information about the ATV/UTV club that has been started in the Town. Currently the Town of Saratoga only has routes. The club would like to develop more routes and add trails within the Town. It is \$20 per person or family to join.

Tom Bauer at 9250 Young Street had his house burn. He got a razing permit and is working with the building inspector. He should have the house down within a month and plans to rebuild on the property.

Town books were audited.

Frank made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Heeg seconded it. Motion passed. The meeting adjourned at 7:35 p.m.
