

October 21, 2009

The Saratoga Town Board met at 6:00 p.m. in the town hall. Chairman Rickaby called the meeting to order. All members were present. The meeting was officially noticed.

Nelson made a motion to approve the October 7th, 2009 minutes. Forbes seconded it. Motion passed.

The hall rental for November 14th was tabled until more information was received.

The mobile home permit for 4820 Wilderness Lane was tabled until information was received.

Forbes made a motion to comply with the recommendation of the Towns' lawyer to move the Plum Creek case to Adams County; combining it with the Town of Rome and Big Flats. Nelson seconded it. Motion passed.

Passineau made a motion to adopt Resolution 10-21-09. It transfers money left from the 2008 budget into the 2009 budget. Frank seconded it. Motion passed.

Passineau made a motion to approve the operator's license for Michele Harris, Mary Bravener and Bernetta Jones. Frank seconded it. Motion passed.

Frank made a motion to approve a three year contract with the Town of Grand Rapids Fire Department. Forbes seconded it. Motion passed. 2% dues will be paid to the three Fire Departments based on the previous years' fire inspections, so they may be dispersed within 30 days of receiving the check from the state.

Dave Ryun gave the Constable's report. He has looked at the property south of PIRCO. There is junk on the property. He will send a letter giving 30 days to clean up. If it will take longer, he would need to come to the board with a clean up plan. Tim Gebert will be representing the Town on the Mark Kocher case on November 18th.

Billie-Jo Kester gave the Treasurer's report. The First Responders are opening a savings account for money that was sent in by town residents. The money will be used for training that is needed by the department.

The board discussed projects that would qualify for TRIP money for 2010. The board decided that Evergreen from Hwy 73 to 52nd Street will be the project proposed for the TRIP program.

The bridge on Bell Road may be pushed back to 2011 depending on whether the State has money for the project. Passineau took pictures and sent them in an effort to get it done as soon as possible.

Correspondences were read.

Frank made a motion to approve the bills paid. Nelson seconded it. Motion passed.

Passineau made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Frank seconded it. Motion passed. The meeting adjourned at 7:35 p.m.
